



5 tips for preventing combustible dust explosions



Anyone whose processing produces combustible dust — food, pharmaceuticals, textiles, etc. — is aware of catastrophe lurking. Here are a few tips from OSHA to prevent explosion:

- Implement a hazardous dust inspection, testing, housekeeping and control program.
- Use proper dust collection systems.
- Regularly inspect for dust residues in open and hidden areas.
- If ignition sources are present, use cleaning methods that do not generate dust clouds.
- Control smoking, open flames and sparks including mechanical sparks and friction.
